Give Give LENT Pray

3rd SUNDAY OF LENT – 12th March 2023

Today's readings focus on living water as a symbol of God's healing love and desire to save. They also remind us of the deep thirst within every human soul that can lead to deep relationship with God or to desert dryness and emptiness. The choice is ours.

TODAYS READINGS:

Exodus 17:3-7: The book of Exodus tells the story of God's unfailing desire to be in relationship with us. However unfaithful we may be, however many false idols we may turn to in our search for security, God will never fail us and always holds to the covenant promises.

RESPONSE TO THE PSALM:

O that today you would listen to his voice! 'Harden not your hearts'.

Romans 5:1-2. 5-8: Paul writes to the Romans, reminding them that through God's grace they have a reliable hope that cannot be disappointed. This is not cheap and easy grace, but the power, through Christ, to live differently and to trust in his promises.

John 4:5-42: The story of the woman of Samaria is rich with resonance. Jesus comes to meet this woman where she is. He listens to her questions and her struggles with faith, trust and hope. He invites her to change her perception of God and by doing so changes her experience of herself.

"The water that I will give will become in them a spring of water gushing up to eternal life"

The woman who met Jesus at the well was despised as a heretical Samaritan, a descendant of the Assyrian occupation. With their mixed Jewish and pagan beliefs, Samaritans were regarded as unfit to worship in the temple in Jerusalem. Thus, the Samaritans built their own temple on Mount Gerizim. Jesus looked beyond national and religious boundaries to the coming of the Spirit who would unite all believers in the worship of one God. At first, the woman was suspicious of Jesus, but as he revealed her inner need, the woman changed her attitude. She addressed him as "sir" then as "prophet." Then she recognized



Jesus as the Messiah, and finally as her personal Saviour. Leaving her empty water jar behind (a symbol of her arid life), the woman ran off to tell the people in the village that she found the Lord. A lot of them believed because of the strength of her testimony. Jesus' disciples had gone to the city to buy food, and when they returned, he asked them to pray for other people, who, like the woman, would harvest the ripe field of souls that lay before them. Each of us needs a personal encounter with Jesus. St. Augustine said, "It was for you that Jesus was weary from the journey."
