

11th Sunday in Ordinary Time & Fathers Day 18th June 2023

God cares for us with infinite compassion. The Lord gathers us together as one family in our celebration of the Eucharist that we may be refreshed and renewed. We may stray like lost sheep, but God always searches us out to bring us back.

Today's Readings:

Exodus 19:2-6: The Lord makes Israel his very own people, a consecrated nation.

Response to the Psalm: We are His people, the sheep of His flock.

Romans 5:6-11: Christ has reconciled and saved us through his death. **Matthew 9:36 – 10:8:** Jesus sends out his disciples to labour in his harvest.

"He summoned the twelve and sent them out"

"As you go, make this proclamation: 'The kingdom of heaven is at hand'".

As Jesus went about teaching and healing, he proclaimed that the kingdom of God had arrived. Jesus was moved with compassion because the people were like "sheep without a shepherd". The people were longing for God, and the religious leaders had nothing to offer them. Jesus asked his disciples to pray that the "Lord"



of the harvest" would send out labourers to care for God's people. The divine shepherd and harvest-master needed human cooperation. Jesus chose twelve ordinary men to be his apostles. The word "apostle" literally meant one who was "sent out". Those Jesus called to share his authority and mission had no wealth, no special education, no social standing. Yet Jesus sent them to announce God's reign to the "lost sheep of the house of Israel". The miracles that accompanied their proclamation were signs of God's reign. The gift that they received was to be freely shared with other people.

ORDINARY TIME

is called "ordinary" because the weeks are numbered. Ordinary Time is in fact the ordered life of the Church—the period in which we live our lives neither in feasting (as in the Christmas and Easter seasons) or in penance (as in Advent and Lent), but in watchfulness and expectation of the Second Coming of Christ There are two periods of Ordinary Time. These vary depending upon when Easter falls in each particular year. The total number of weeks of Ordinary Time in any given year is 33 or 34.
