13th Sunday of Ordinary Time - 2nd July 2023

We are called to take up our cross and follow Christ. We gather as the body of Christ, walking the way of the cross and rejoicing in the true freedom of the children of God. Jesus invites us to let go of everything that keeps us from love, and to open ourselves to his mercy.

Today's Readings:

2 Kings 4:8-11. 14-16: The prophet Elisha receives hospitality and repays it with the promise of new life.

Response to the Psalm: I will sing forever of your love, O Lord.

Romans 6:3-4. 8-11: By baptism, we come to share in the divine life of Christ.

Matthew 10:37-42: To be worthy of Christ, we must take up our cross and follow him.

"Whoever does not take up his cross and follow after me is not worthy of me"

Jesus preached a message of total renunciation for the sake of the kingdom. Nothing or no one must deter them from their dedication to Christ and his mission. Jesus knew that not everyone would accept the gospel his followers proclaimed. Even members of their families might be their adversaries. Those who wished to follow in Jesus' footsteps must be willing to put the gospel before all else, even their own lives. If they chose this difficult path, they could be sure that they would share Jesus' destiny of persecution and suffering. Those who refused to "take up the cross" and follow him were "not worthy" of being his disciples. Like the prophets of old they must be prepared to suffer for speaking God's word. Jesus' disciples were Christian "prophets" who spoke God's saving message. Whoever offered hospitality to these messengers of God received Jesus himself and God who sent him, and they would be rewarded for their kindness.

ORDINARY TIME

is called "ordinary" because the weeks are numbered. Ordinary Time is in fact the ordered life of the Church—the period in which we live our lives neither in feasting (as in the Christmas and Easter seasons) or in penance (as in Advent and Lent), but in watchfulness and expectation of the Second Coming of Christ There are two periods of Ordinary Time. These vary depending upon when Easter falls in each particular year. The total number of weeks of Ordinary Time in any given year is 33 or 34.
