<u>16th Sunday in Ordinary Time - 23rd July 2023</u> Sunday Cycle: Year A (Matthew). Weekdays: Year 1

God is good, and God's goodness is to be seen especially in God's justice and patience. Today's parable encourages us to imitate God in justice and mercy.

Today's Readings:

Wisdom 12:13. 16-19: God, who is all-powerful, shows strength in gentle judgement.

Response to the Psalm:

O Lord, you are good and forgiving.

Romans 8:26-27: God understands our weakness and the Spirit expresses our yearning.

Matthew 13:24-43: The world, God's field of wheat, is invaded with darnel weed. Let it grow till harvest time.



Master, did you not sow good seed in your field? Where, then, did these weeds come from?"

Jesus was a good teacher. He used stories about the ordinary things of life to reveal the deep mysteries of God's reign. The parables often cantered on the domestic, and agricultural work of the community. These parables aroused curiosity and invited Jesus' audience to search for the meaning, which often applied to their own lives. The parable of the weeds among the wheat revealed that good and evil would exist alongside one another until the Day of Judgment. The weed in the story was darnel, a noxious plant that closely resembled wheat. In the early stages of development, it was impossible to distinguish the one *Let them both grow till the harvest* from the other. When the wheat ripened, the experienced eye would be able to differentiate between the two. The problem was that the roots were so intertwined that the weeds could not

be uprooted without tearing up the wheat. So it is with evil; it is difficult to detect in its early stages until it grows strong and destroys what is good. Jesus cautioned the disciples not to attempt to forcibly root out the unbelievers among their fellow Jews. The harvest was a common Old Testament symbol for the final judgment. Jesus' advice was patient tolerance until God would render his verdict on saint and sinner.
