### **Today's Readings:**

**Ezekiel 18:25-28:** It is right that we receive the just rewards of our actions, good or evil.

### Response to the Psalm: Remember your mercy, Lord.

**Philippians 2:1-11:** In our minds we must be like Christ Jesus, who emptied himself that he might be raised by God in glory.

Matthew 21:28-32: We receive the reward of true righteousness.

# "Amen, I say to you, tax collectors and prostitutes are entering the kingdom of God before you".

Jesus confronted the hypocritical religious leaders with a parable of two sons, one who gave lip service to his father and the other who repented of his disobedience.

The parable teaches us that promises can never take the place of performance. The son who said he would go, but did not, was like the religious leaders who claimed to be doing God's will but acted otherwise. The tax collectors and the prostitutes were those who said that they would go their own way and then take God's way. The religious authorities held the "tax collectors and prostitutes" in contempt because they did not obey God. Yet when these outcasts of society heard John's message of repentance, they reformed their lives. In contrast, the



leaders of God's people stubbornly refused to believe in John's way of righteousness and did not change their lives. Because they rejected God's plan for salvation, they forfeited their place in God's reign. The ideal son is the one who accepts the father's orders with obedience and fully carries them out.

# <u>Saint Francis of Assisi.</u>



Francis, son of a rich cloth merchant, had a misspent youth. His search for change led him to the ancient church at San Damiano. While praying there, he heard Christ speak to him from the crucifix,

"Francis, repair my church." Francis assumed this meant the crumbling building he was in. Acting on impulse, he took fabric from his father's shop and sold it to get money to repair the church. His father dragged Francis before the bishop and in front of the whole town demanding that he return the money and renounce all rights as his heir. Francis not only gave back the money but stripped off the clothes his father had given him, and declared that from then on his true Father was God in heaven. Francis took the Gospels as the rule of his life, and Jesus Christ as his example. He dressed in rough clothes and begged for his food. He visited hospitals, served the sick, cared for lepers, preached purity and peace, composed songs and hymns to God and nature, and regarded everyone as his brothers nd sister. He began to attract followers, and in 1209, with a papal blessing, founded the Franciscans. In 1212 Clare of Assisi became his spiritual follower, which led to the founding of the Poor Clares. While in meditation on Mount Alvernia in the Apennines in September 1224, Francis received the stigmata, which periodically bled during the remaining two years of his life.
