

Christ the King of the Universe - 26th November 2023

The abuse of power is evident in so many ways in our world, within the Church, among nations and by individuals. As Christians, we are called to follow Christ's example of the power of service, shown supremely by his death on the cross. The power wielded by Christ was that of service: to heal, to forgive, to love. We seek forgiveness now for the occasions we have abused power in our own lives.

Today's Readings;

Ezekiel 34:11-12. 15-17: The Lord promises to look after the flock himself.

<u>Response to the Psalm</u>: The Lord is my shepherd; there is nothing I shall want.

1 Corinthians 15:20-26. 28: All shall be brought to life in Christ. Matthew 25:31-46: The last judgement of the nations.

"Come, you who are blessed by my Father. Inherit the kingdom prepared for you from the foundation of the world"

In Jesus' last discourse in Matthew's gospel, he gave a graphic illustration of the last judgment in which the righteous were separated from the wicked. Jesus' image was drawn from the practice of pasturing sheep and goats together during the day, and then separating them at nightfall. At the Last Judgment, the righteous "sheep" were given a favoured place at Christ's "right hand. They were the ones who heard the shepherd's voice and responded through corporal works of mercy. Those who have done good deeds for one of "these least brothers of mine" will be blessed, but those who have failed to do these deeds for one of "these least ones" will be condemned. The good deeds are feeding the hungry, offering hospitality to the homeless, clothing the naked, comforting the sick, and visiting the imprisoned. St. John of the Cross wrote:



"When the evening of this life comes, we will be judged on love."

<u>The Solemnity of</u> <u>Our Lord Jesus</u> <u>Christ, the King of</u>

the Universe is the last

Sunday of the liturgical year. On this day, we contemplate the kingship of Jesus our Redeemer. Pope Pius XI instituted the feast of Christ the King in 1925 to remind

Christians that their allegiance was to their spiritual ruler in heaven as opposed to earthly supremacy claimed by dictators at that time. Nowadays, we need this reminder that our first allegiance must be to Christ the King, especially as we face the temptations of our growing culture of secularism. The feast has an eschatological dimension pointing to the end of time when the kingdom of Jesus will be established in all its fullness to the ends of the earth. It also leads to Advent, when the Church prepares for the arrival of the new-born king. The New Liturgical Year begins with the First Sunday of Advent, December 3. The year is **Year B** - we read **Mark's Gospel** in the coming year.

NIGHT SHELTER - 2024

It has been confirmed that we will be running the **Night Shelter** as part of the **NewDawn** project at the start of 2024. We will open our doors on <u>Wednesday nights</u> starting on <u>January 10th</u> 2024 and our last night will be <u>February 28th</u> 2024. We will open <u>every week</u> doing eight nights in all. The forms for signing up for duties are at the back of the Church. As before, we hope to run with many people doing what they can manage rather than a few people doing everything.
