<u> 28th January 2024 – 4th Sunday in Ordinary Time</u>

As he travels around, Jesus is recognised by what he says and what he does. Let us come before the Lord and listen to his voice.

Today's Readings

Deuteronomy 18:15-20: God will raise a prophet among you who will speak with the Lord's word.

Response to the Psalm: O that today you would listen to his voice! 'Harden not you hearts'.

1 Corinthians 7:32-35: Paul invites people to fulfil their role for which the Lord has called them, free from worry.

Mark 1:21-28: The crowd recognises Jesus as a prophet who offers a teaching that is new, which he speaks with authority.

"What is this? A new teaching with authority."

The scholars of the Law held positions of authority because of their great learning, but Jesus taught on his own authority (Greek exousia, the power that "came out of his very being"). The people were enthralled by the power of Jesus' words. They marvelled that he taught like the ancient prophets, not like the teachers they were acquainted with. While teaching in the synagogue at Capernaum, Jesus healed a man possessed by an "unclean spirit". Unlike the religious leaders, the demons knew that divine power was at work in Jesus, and they attempted to overpower Jesus by invoking his name. Jesus was more powerful than the demons, and he rebuked them and commanded them to be silent. The crowds were astonished, and at the same time, they were perplexed as they did not yet understand the true identity of Jesus. Jesus' fame continued to spread throughout the whole region of Galilee.

FEAST OF THE PRESENTATION OF THE LORD

FRIDAY 2ND FEBRUARY 2024.

LUKE 2:22-40 or 2:22-32

(Malachi 3:1-4; Psalm 24; Hebrews 2:14-18)

"For my eyes have seen your salvation which you prepared in sight of all the peoples".

After the birth of Jesus in Bethlehem, Mary spent forty days in ritual purification from childbirth (Lev. 12:3-4). When the days of her ritual purification were fulfilled, the couple brought the infant Jesus to the temple to offer the sacrifice required by the Law. One of Israel's deepest hopes was to re-establish the temple as the place of right worship so that the glory of the Lord might return. When Joseph and Mary brought the infant Jesus into the temple, the prophecy of Malachi was fulfilled. In the temple that day was Simeon and Anna, two elderly people, who faithfully awaited the deliverance of Israel. Simeon praised God for allowing him to behold the one who would bring salvation to everyone. Then Simeon directed his words to Mary saying that a "sword would pierce her heart". Her deep faith would not spare her from sharing the suffering of her son. Anna was a devout widow who spent her days praying and fasting for the redemption of Israel. She was a "prophetess," one who interpreted God's actions in the world. Anna gave thanks to God and told everyone that deliverance would come through the child Jesus. Afterward, Mary and Joseph returned to Nazareth where Jesus grew in age, wisdom, and in the grace of God. Mass at 12.15pm. NOTE: Candlemas. The Feast of the Presentation of the Lord commemorates the presentation of the infant Jesus in the temple. It also marks the ritual purification of Mary after the birth of her son. A mother was brought to the temple or synagogue and ritually purified. Then she could go out in public and to religious services. The feast is also called Candlemas Day because that is the day on which the year's supply of candles for the church are blessed. Christians observed Candlemas Day in Jerusalem as early as the 4th century. By the middle of the 5th century, candles were lit on this day to symbolize that Jesus Christ was the light of the world.

Racial Justice Sunday 2024 ...

••• highlights the global refugee crisis, emphasising Europe as a destination. Despite the UK's exit from the EU, its ties to Europe persist. Attitudes toward immigration have hardened, influenced by the refugee crisis, political opportunism, and cost-ofliving challenges

108.4 million people around the world have been forced to flee their homes. Among them nearly 35.3 million refugees. About 41 per cent of them are under the age of 18.' Arrivals from Afghanistan, Syria and the Ukraine – the top three countries in the world for refugees. Conflicts in parts of Africa, the Middle East and Asia have also been 'push' factors for movement to Europe. On Racial Justice Sunday, we highlight these issues and explore how Christians can contribute by recognising the racial and interfaith dimensions of the problem.
