# 7<sup>TH</sup> JANUARY 2024 THE EPIPHANY OF THE LORD

The Magi have been following the star, the mysterious sign in the skies, and they now bow down humbly before the Christ Child offering prayer and gifts. We thank God for his graciousness and giftedness to each one of us.

## **Today's Readings**

**Isaiah 60:1-6:** Arise, shine out Jerusalem, for your light has come.

Response to the Psalm: All nations shall fall prostrate before you, O Lord.

**Ephesians 3:"-3.5-6:** All people share in the promise and salvation of God.

Matthew: 1-1": And falling to their knees, they did him homage.

"We saw his star at its rising and have come to do him homage"

Matthew wrote his gospel for a Jewish group of Christians, to show that Jesus was the fulfilment of their longings for a Messiah (see genealogy, Mt 1:1-17). He also wanted to show that God's salvation would reach "to the end of the earth" (Is 49:6). Matthew signalled this intention by telling about gentiles, strangers, coming to visit the Holy Family in Bethlehem. These "wise men" (Greek: "magi", "astrologers") believed that a new star indicated the birth of a new ruler, and they had observed his star at its rising. The magi came from the East, where



the sun rises, and the star guided them to Jesus, the true light that was to come into the world. When they arrived in Jerusalem, they asked King Herod the Great where they could find the new-born king of the Jews. Herod's advisers told him that the prophet Micah had foretold the birth of a Messiah in Bethlehem, the birthplace of David where David was also anointed king. Fearing that this child would be a threat to his throne, Herod sent the magi to search for the new-born king on the pretence of offering him homage. The star illuminated the way to the Christ child and to Mary his mother. The magi offered the child gifts that signified his kingship (gold), h is priesthood (frankincense), and his saving death (myrrh, used in anointing the dead). The magi were warned in a dream not to return to Herod, so they returned 'by another way'. We are all invited to discover the Lord. However, after encountering Christ, we cannot return to our old ways. We've got to travel in a different direction--the path that leads to him. **NOTE**: The word "epiphany" means a 'manifestation' or an appearance of a supernatural being. Their are three 'manifestations associated with 'The Epiphany': The manifestation to the pagans at 'The coming of the Magi; the Baptism of Jesus when the heavens were torn open and the voice from heaven manifested Jesus as "My Son, the beloved; my favour rest on you"; and the Wedding at Cana, in Galilee when his power was manifested by his first miracle. Because the magi brought three gifts, legend made them "three kings," on the assumption that none of them would be so 'unwise' as not to bring a gift! They were given the names of Caspar, Melchior, and Balthasar.

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

# FEAST OF THE BAPTISM OF

### THE LORD

Monday 8 January 2024. Mark 1:7-11 (Isaiah 55:1-11; Psalm 29; 1 John 5:1-9) "You are my Son the beloved; my favour rests



JESUS CAME? Ritual washings were practiced by various groups in Palestine between 150 BC and AD 250. Jews practiced many kinds of water purifications Jewish Priests washed themselves ritually before exercising any sacred function.

People had to be purified with water to prepare them for worship. The Qumran community near the Dead Sea practiced many daily water purifications (John the Baptist may have been a member of this ascetic community). In the gospels, there is the baptism of John baptizing Jesus, and there is the baptism in the name of Christ in the Church. They are two distinct thongs. Christian baptism is an identification with the death and resurrection of Jesus Christ. The baptism of John was a Jewish washing. Throughout Jewish history, it was traditional for Jews to demonstrate repentance through washing ceremonies. John was preaching repentance for the coming of God's reign. The people who accepted that message and desired to repent came to John. The internal conversion of their heart was demonstrated externally in their baptism in anticipation for the arrival of Messiah. It was a baptism of repentance, and so it was Jewish baptism.
