31st March 2024 – EASTER SUNDAY – The Resurrection of The Lord.

On Easter Sunday we gather as a community to celebrate the resurrection of Jesus. We give grateful thanks for this happy day, and for the opportunities we have been given to pass the love and hope of the Risen Christ to everyone we meet. Jesus invites us to let go of everything that weighs us down, so that we too can rise with him in the hope and joy of Easter.

Today's Reading

Acts 10:34.37-43 God does not have favourites: the resurrection is for everyone.

Response to the Psalm: This day was made by the Lord: we rejoice and are glad.

Colossians 3:1-4

OR 1 Corinthians 5:6-8

Now the life you have is hidden with Christ in God. Leave your old ways behind and embrace the Gospel.

John 20:1-9 Jesus has risen from the dead – nothing will ever be the same again.

Most of us will have experienced some kind of disappointment, pain or failure – it is part of life and cannot be avoided. For some this will be the loss of a loved one, or the break-up of a marriage. For others it might be persistent ill health, a job they don't enjoy or financial hardship. Some people may perhaps feel that life has been a disappointment, a series of small, exhausting setbacks and broken dreams. We all have our own crosses to bear. For the disciples, the crucifixion and death of Jesus on Good Friday must have signalled the ultimate dashing of all their hopes and dreams. They had seen him as the Messiah, the anointed one, the one who was to save them... and now he was gone. But everything changed when Christ rose from the dead that first Easter Sunday – nothing would ever be the same again. Without the resurrection the Jesus story would have been

an interesting footnote in history – a miracle worker, a holy man, remembered with fondness and a little disappointment by his friends. As each of the apostles passed away, the memories would have dimmed and the whole movement withered away; a few stories passed on to grandchildren perhaps and – and then nothing. The resurrection means that we can say, "Jesus is alive!" in the present tense. He has conquered death, not just for himself, but for everyone and all times. It enables us to say "He lives among us", not a figure from history, but as a living presence – in the present. The risen Christ transcends time and space – he is available everywhere to everybody. For the disciples, the resurrection meant that Jesus had fulfilled the promise he had made to them. He truly was the Son of God. He appeared to them in various places in the days that followed, enabling Thomas "doubting Thomas" to proclaim, "My Lord and my God!" More than just an ordinary man, the Word made flesh, the risen Lord, was ready to fill his followers with his Holy Spirit so that the Christian Church could begin and then spread to every corner of the globe.

Pray for those who have died, and those whose Anniversaries occur around this time, also, please pray for the sick, and, remember the People of Ukraine, and all countries where there is war. We also pray for peace in the Holy Land.

Following an ancient tradition, the Church regards the eight days (the Octave) from Easter Sunday of the Resurrection to the Second Sunday of Easter as one single unit of celebration. The preface for Easter Sunday is used each day of the week and on the following Sunday: "We praise you with greater joy than ever on this Easter day" - even though Easter Sunday is a week behind us. The double "Alleluia" is added at the end of each Mass. The celebration of the liturgy is full of joy and the Easter season of 50 days (with the Paschal Candle lit on the Sanctuary) continues as one great feast (sometimes called "The Great Sunday") to Pentecost (19th May)

On **Saturday 6th April 2024** at **10:30am**, the Holy Communion candidates for this year will be making their First Confession – please keep them in your prayers.


PILGRIMAGE TO WALSINGHAM SATURDAY 25TH MAY 2024.
