Today's Gospel shows us that Jesus sees our loveliness before he sees our brokenness. He can heal the cracks and flaws which we try to hide even from ourselves. Jesus never tires of forgiving us. He makes our very brokenness an opportunity for healing and new life.

## Today's Readings

Acts 3:13-15. 17-19: God glorified Jesus by raising him back to life.

### **<u>RESPONSE TO THE PSALM</u>:** Lift up the light of your face on us, O Lord.

**1 John 2:1-5:** True love of Jesus means listening to him and obeying his word.

Luke 24:35-48: Jesus appears to the disciples hiding in the Upper Room and, instead of condemning their Good Friday cowardice, offers a greeting of peace.

### "It was written that the Messiah would suffer and rise from the dead on the third day".

The disciples of Emmaus returned to Jerusalem and reported to the eleven apostles that they had witnessed the Risen Christ. The Apostles in turn exclaimed that Christ had also appeared to Simon Peter. While they were still speaking, Christ appeared in their midst and proclaimed "Peace" to them. He assured the terrified disciples that he was not a ghost. When he invited them to touch him and asked for food, the disciples were overjoyed. Again, Jesus explained everything that had been written about him in the "Law of Moses and in the prophets and psalms". These three divisions of the Hebrew Scriptures are the law "Torah," the Prophets "Nebi'im," and the Writings "Kethubim" (acronym: "TaNaK"). Then Jesus commissioned his disciples to preach the message of salvation in his name: "repentance for the forgiveness of sins, beginning from Jerusalem"

# EASTER

This Greatest Feast lasts 50 day – until Pentecost on 19<sup>th</sup> May. Easter, like Christmas, is not a day, but a season—in fact, the longest "season" of the liturgical year. The challenge to us is how to keep the light and life of Easter before us for the whole



fifty days. An answer is to let our Churches and our Liturgies flow with fire, light and water for fifty days. Each time we gather, we sing or say "Alleluia!", an affirmation that we rise in the Risen Christ: during Easter, the Word of God speaks to us, day by day, about the great "mysteries", Baptism and the Eucharist, whereby we become and are the Body of Christ. The culmination of the Easter Season is the great solemnity of Pentecost. The time of new birth is behind us: now we live as the Church, empowered and enflamed by the Spirit. Pentecost leads to "Ordinary" time, when we will learn once more, year by year, about what it means to follow Christ.
