17th Sunday in Ordinary Time – 24th July 2022

Today's readings speak to us of drawing closer to God in prayer. It's through prayer that we can grow in friendship and communion with God. Jesus teaches us that we will be forgiven in the same measure that we forgive others. Let us ask his forgiveness and mercy.

Lord, you proclaimed that the kingdom of God is close at hand. Lord, have mercy.

Lord, you feed us with your body and blood.

Christ, have mercy.

Lord, you forgive us our sins as we forgive those who sin against us. Lord, have mercy.

Today's Readings

Genesis 18:20-32: Abraham, the friend of God, asks God to have mercy on a sinful city.

RESPONSE TO THE PSALM: On the day I called You, You answered me, O Lord.

Colossians 2:12-14: Paul assures us that God's forgiveness of sin is total and absolute.

Luke 11:1-13: Jesus teaches those who follow him to call God "Father" and invites them into

his own life of prayer.

"Lord, teach us to pray just as John taught his disciples"

All through Luke's gospel, Jesus is shown praying at every important moment of his life. It was seeing Jesus at prayer that moved his disciples to ask him to teach them how to pray, and he gave them the "Lord's Prayer". In Matthew's gospel, the Lord's Prayer begins with "Our Father". We experience God's fatherhood not as isolated individuals but as members of the Church. By contrast, Luke's gospel simply says, "Father", which expresses Jesus' unique relationship with God whom he called "Abba, Father." Spend time meditating on each line of the Lord's Prayer in Luke's gospel, making it your own: "Father" ... Do I live like a son or daughter of God? ... "Hallowed be your name"... Do I respect the Lord's name? ...

"Your Kingdom come"... Do I work to bring about the reign of God? ... "Your will be done" . . . Do I pray for God's will or my will to be done? "Give us each day our daily bread" ... Do I trust God to provide for my daily needs? ... "Forgive us our sins" ... Do I believe that God can absolve me of my sins?

"As we forgive everyone who trespasses against us" ... Am I willing to forgive and forget the sins of other people? ... "Deliver us from evil" ... What is the greatest evil that I need to resist? Pray that you will not fail God in times of trial.


FIRST HOLY COMMUNION 2023
