17TH SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME AND WORLD DAY FOR GRANDPARENTS & THE ELDERLY.

We've got a gap in our Gospel readings from St Mark: for the next month we will be listening to the sixth chapter of the Gospel of St John. This chapter elaborates the teaching of Jesus on the Eucharist, and we begin today with the miracle of the feeding of the crowd with the five barley loaves and two fish. We call to mind how we are nourished with the body and blood of Christ himself.

TODAYS READINGS:

2 Kings 4:42-44 – Elisha feeds the people with barley loaves and fresh grain.


RESPONSE TO THE PSALM: You open wide your hand, O Lord, and grant our desires.

Ephesians 4:1-6 – We should do all we can to preserve the unity of the Spirit by the peace that binds us together.

John 6:1-15 – Jesus feeds the crowd with the five barley loaves and two fish, and twelve hampers of scraps are left over.

"This is truly the Prophet, the one who is to come into the world".

The miracle of the multiplication of bread is narrated by all four Gospel-writers, which indicates its Eucharistic importance for the early Church. In John's gospel, the miracle took place 'near Passover', the Jewish unleavened bread feast. When the Israelites were wandering in the wilderness and dying of hunger, God fed them with manna. Jesus declared that he himself was the bread that came "down from heaven" to give "life to the world". Like the prophet Elisha, Jesus took the loaves of barley bread, the humble food of the poor, gave thanks (Greek, eucharisteō), broke and distributed it to the hungry people. The people's reaction: "This is truly the Prophet, the one who is to come into the world," refers to "a prophet like Moses". who was anticipated in the final days. However, the people looked for a Messiah who would be king and a conqueror who would drive the Romans from the land. When Jesus realized this, he withdrew to the mountain alone.
