SUNDAY 8th SEPTEMBER 2024 23rd Sunday in Ordinary Time. **Education Sunday.**

On this Education Sunday we celebrate the work of all educators and everyone who teaches 9and learns0 in our schools and colleges. We gather today in community, giving thanks for everything we have received, and committing ourselves to pass on the Gospel of Christ to everyone we meet.

TODAYS READINGS:

Isaiah 35:4-7 - God will open the eyes of the blind and the ears of the deaf.

RESPONSE TO THE PSALM: My soul, give praise to the Lord.

James 2:1-5 - Belief in Christ means that we should treat everyone equally. God does not favour the rich over the poor and neither should we.

Mark 7:31-37 - Jesus heals both the body and the soul. He enables us all to see and hear more clearly.

"He has done all things well. He makes the deaf hear and the mute speak"

Jesus went to the Gentile area of the Decapolis, a league of ten cities in eastern Palestine. There a deaf man with a speech impediment was brought to him for healing. Perhaps it was the man's inability to hear that made his speech unintelligible. The gestures that Jesus used to effect the cure were used by healers of his time. Jesus put his hands in the man's ears and touched his tongue with spittle, which was thought to have curative powers. Then he groaned "Be opened" (Aramaic, "Ephphatha," still used in baptismal ceremonies today). Jesus looked to heaven, the divine source of his healing power, and with a word and touch, the man's hearing and speech were restored. He thus fulfilled the Messianic promise that "the deaf shall hear" and "the mute will sing". Fearing his deeds might be misinterpreted as mere "wonderworking," Jesus asked the people not to talk about this miracle. But they acted like the deaf, unable to hear his command. Even so, they were not mute in announcing his praises. This miracle performed for a Gentile was another sign that Jesus had come to bring salvation to all everyone.
