Pray that God may help us grow in our sense of service and let us serve our family members today to the best of our

ability, better yet the entire week.

TODAYS READINGS:

1st Reading: Isaiah 53:10-11 - Through his suffering, the servant of Yahweh will justify many.

RESPONSE TO THE PSALM: May your love be upon us, O Lord, as we place all our hope in you.

2nd Reading: Hebrews 4:14-16 - Jesus is the high priest who sympathizes with our weakness.

Gospel: Mark 10:35-45 - Jesus teaches that those who wish to be great must be the servant of all.

In the Gospel of Mark, Jesus taught his disciples the true meaning of messiahship, which was the giving of himself for the life of others. However, his disciples were too slow to learn by heart the meaning of his messiahship. Their capacity to learn the way of Jesus was impeded by their distorted understanding of greatness. Their idea of greatness was associated with political power wherein the powerful lord is over the rest. But for Jesus, greatness could only mean service.



Pope Pius XI instituted **World Mission Sunday** in 1926. It calls us to a renewed commitment to our responsibility to spread the Gospel message. Since the Church is by her very nature missionary, evangelisation constitutes a duty and a right for every one of her members (cf. Vatican II: Lumen gentium). The Lord calls us to go beyond ourselves and to share with other people the blessings we've



received, beginning with the gift of faith, which cannot be considered as a private privilege but has got to be seen as a gift to be shared with people who have not yet received it. Such activity will benefit faith itself: faith is strengthened when it is shared. (Pope John Paul II, 1992). Pray for all the work of evangelisation in the Church. Pray for those who have died, and those whose Anniversaries occur around this time, also, please pray for the sick, also remember the People of Ukraine, and all countries where there is war. We also pray for peace in the Holy Land.
