25th Sunday of Ordinary Time – 18th September 2022

Today's readings show us that holiness and justice go hand in hand. Acting justly towards those who are poor and doing justice in our day-to-day lives are not options. They are an integral part of what it means to be a person of faith, serving the God who is the source of all justice and compassion.

Today's Readings

Amos 8:4-7: The prophet speaks in blunt terms. Religious observance without concern for justice towards people who are poor is nothing but empty show.

Response to the Psalm: Praise the Lord, who raises the poor.

1 Timothy 2:1-8: Prayer is essential, not only in individual terms but as the obligation of the whole community. It is important for the common good that we take our responsibility to pray seriously, even when we cannot see the results.

Luke 16:1-13: The parable of the dishonest steward appears baffling at first sight. But the key is in the final comment: whoever is faithful in little is faithful in much; and whoever is dishonest in little will be dishonest in much.



You cannot be the slave both of God and of money.

One of the important themes in Luke's Gospel is the right use of material goods. In the parable off the dishonest steward, Jesus contrasted the **shrewdness** of worldly people in planning for the future with the apparent **indifference** of the children of the kingdom. In the story, a steward mismanaged his master's funds. Faced with the loss of employment and knowing that he was unused to physical work and too proud to beg, he devised a scheme. He forfeited his own commission, thereby reducing the amount owed by the debtors, thus ingratiating himself with both debtor and master. Jesus praised the enterprising steward for acting prudently, but he challenged his own disciples to consider whether they were as wise in the use of their goods as those who acted without the guiding light of the Holy Spirit. Jesus warned his disciples that they could not serve both the god of materialism (*money*) and the God of the universe. You can't be a servant of God and a slave to material goods at the same time.


FEAST OF ST. FRANCIS OF ASSISI
