## 26th Sunday of Ordinary Time – 25th September 2022

Each Sunday is a celebration of the Easter mystery, the centre of our Christian faith. We gather in the presence of our risen Lord, who is here among us, as he promised his disciples he would be when they come together.

When we prepare to celebrate our Sunday Eucharist, we always begin by admitting our shortcomings in living up to our calling as disciples of Jesus; we ask the Lord's forgiveness, but more importantly, grace and strength for the week ahead.

### **Today's Readings**

**Amos 6:1. 4-7:** The prophet denounces the complacency of wealthy people who live a life of luxury and pleasure, while ignoring the dangers into which the society around them is falling.

### Response to the Psalm: My soul, give praise to the Lord

**1 Timothy 6:11-16:** The writer encourages the young leader of the community to take Jesus as his example and so live up to the demands and responsibilities of his position.

**Luke 16:19-31:** Jesus tells the story of the fate of the rich man and the beggar Lazarus, warning his listeners of the danger of neglecting those who are in need of help and assistance.

# "If they do not listen to Moses and the prophets, neither will they be persuaded if someone should rise from the dead"

Jesus addressed a parable to people who were rich in material goods yet ignored the needs of the poor.

In the story, a wealthy man feasted in luxury while Lazarus, a poor man, was outside his house, lying in agony, suffering from disease and starvation. When the two men died, their fortunes were reversed. Lazarus was taken to the "bosom of Abraham", where the just awaited resurrection, while the rich man ended up in torment in the netherworld (Hebrew, Sheol) the underworld which received the dead). Jesus isn't saying that wealth is bad, and poverty is good. But where the rich are worse is in eyesight. We see – but we don't see! We reach out – but we never reach across. That's why it's hard, as Jesus said, for a rich person to enter the kingdom of heaven. The rich man pleaded with Abraham to send someone to warn his family lest they ended up sharing a similar fate. But Jesus said, if they did not listen to "Moses and the prophets" (the scriptures) they would not believe anyone else, even if that person should rise from the dead (Jesus' own resurrection)
